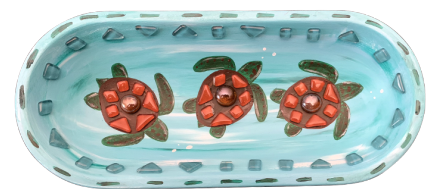




Sea Turtle Centerpiece Kit

Materials Included:

- Ceramic Platter
- Teal, Dark Teal, White, Green, Dark Green, Brown Acrylic Paints
- Brown Mosaic Pieces (Round)
- Brown Mosaic Pieces (Misc. Shapes)
- Teal Mosaic Pieces
- Sea Turtle Template
- Glue
- Paint Brush
- Display Stand

Instructions

Step 1: Paint 2 coats of Teal Acrylic Paint on the inside and rim of the Ceramic Platter. While the Teal Acrylic Paint is still wet, use the White and Dark Teal Acrylic paints and lightly add some brushy strokes blended in with the Teal Paint (to resemble water). Let dry (should only take a few minutes).

Step 2: Next once the front is completely dry, turn the Ceramic Platter over. Paint 2 coats of Brown Acrylic Paint. While the Brown Acrylic Paint is still wet, use the Dark Teal and Dark Green Acrylic Paints and add some brushy strokes blended in with the Brown (to resemble the texture of a turtle shell). Let dry.

Step 3: Next take the Sea Turtle Template and cut out entire turtle. Place your template where you want your turtle to go on the Ceramic Platter and trace with a pencil or magic marker. Repeat tracing so you will have 3 turtles total. Position Turtles however you would like! Using your pencil/magic marker be sure to draw in the rounded outlines for the turtle shell. You can also cut out the turtle shell part of the template after you have already traced all 3 turtles on your platter. You can use this piece to trace the shell on your turtles.

Step 4: Once all of the Sea Turtle outlines are on your platter, use the Green Acrylic Paint and fill in the head, flippers and tail of the turtles. You may need to do 2 coats. Then use the Dark Green Acrylic Paint and make brushy marks to add texture on these parts. Then using the White Acrylic Paint add a few high light brush marks on these areas as well. Let dry.

Step 5: Using the Brown Acrylic Paint, paint 2 coats inside the turtle shells. Then use the Dark Green and White Acrylic Paint and add some brushy strokes on the shell. Let dry.

Step 6: Next use the Brown Paint and add some dots and spots on the turtles head and flippers. Let dry.

Step 7: Then use the White Acrylic Paint and add some white dots for bubbles near the turtle heads, or wherever else you would like!

Step 8: Use the Dark Teal Acrylic Paint and add decorative dash marks around the rim of the platter. Let dry.

Step 9: Take the Round Brown Mosaic Pieces and glue 1 in the center of each turtle shell. A little glue goes a long way so only use a dab on the back of the mosaic pieces.

Step 10: Then take the other Brown Mosaic Pieces and glue them around the rest of the turtle shell. Be sure to leave spaces in between so you can see the paint underneath. You should be able to use about 7 of these pieces per turtle. Let the glue dry completely (should take about 10-15 minutes).

Step 11: Finally glue the Teal Mosaic Pieces around the inside edge of the platter. (Tip: Add small dab of glue and hold piece in place for a few seconds. This will prevent the mosaic pieces from sliding down.) Let the glue dry completely and enjoy! **** This piece is not food safe. Use for display purposes only.****

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
